

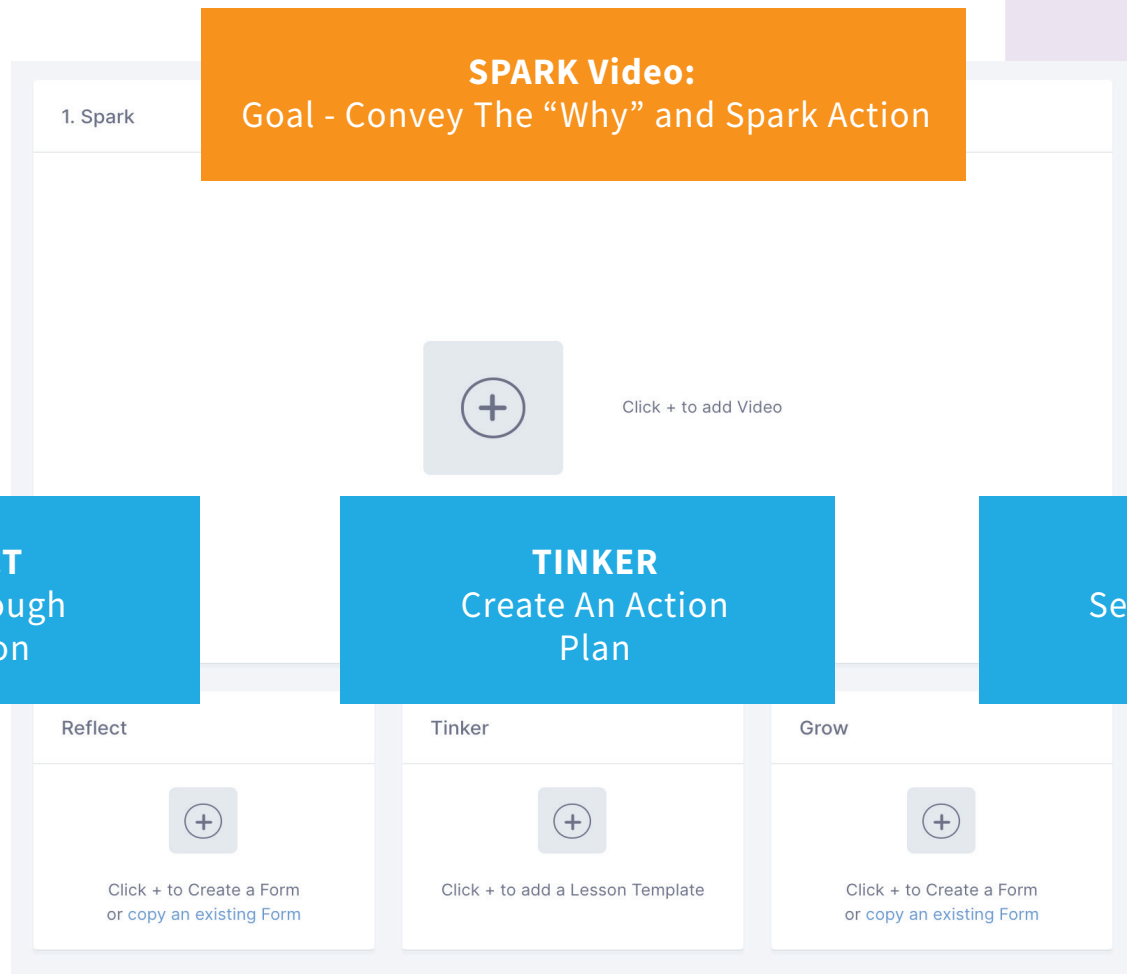

How to Make Your Spark Video

Win: Learners understand “why” a strategy is important from a personal perspective. They have an increased awareness and are excited to take action.

Here's a Sample

3 easy ways to make a video:

#1: Simply Smile & Speak to the Camera

Use a tool like QuickTime or Photo Booth to record a simple video of you explaining the why and prompting action.

#2: Make a Screencast

Use a tool like Screencastify or QuickTime to record your screen and your voice at the same time.

#3: Record Your Voice & Add Graphics

Use a tool like Voice Memo on your phone or QuickTime on a computer to record your voice. Then use a tool like iMovie to add the voice to pictures or graphics.

Tips:

- Save the video for last in the cycle creation process.
- This content should be your original content or content you have permission to use.
- Keep it short, 2-4 minutes max.
- Start with a story from your experience.
- Focus on WHY something is important, not the “what” first.
- Share briefly any key ideas or “the what” but remember you can do more of this in other areas of the cycle.
- Write a script to make recording easier.

REFLECT

Win: Learners have engaged in reflection as learning. They've answered some thoughtful questions as they have explored new frameworks or information.

Here's a Sample

Tips:

- Insert video or images which may prompt reflection.
- Ask questions that start with phrases like:
 - To what extent do you see...
 - What is your current practice...
 - How would you prioritize...
 - In which of the following ways do you already (or want to) do...
- Use a combination of question types for better prompted reflection and coaching data.



TINKER

Win: Learners have made a plan to do action research or try something new in their practice.

Here's a Sample

Tips:

- Use a document so learners can fill out the template.
- Use a table with planning prompts for learners to fill out the empty cells.
- Link helpful samples of completed templates or other resources.
- Keep it simple.



Win: Learners have reflected on their action plan and set goals for continued growth.

Here's a Sample

Tips:

- Ask questions such as:
 - How did your action plan reflect (key concepts)?
 - How did it go?
 - What did you observe or learn?
 - How will you build upon your learning?
 - What support do you need to deepen your practice?
- Use media to remind learners of key concepts.
- Ask a variety of question types.

- Link other documents like sample templates and tools.

Key Concepts
